accrued Sabbatical leave from Dec 1^{st} – April 30^{th} , returning to the congregation on May 1^{st} .

Things appear to be settled, with temporary coverage and support for Sunday morning programming. Our five teachers Charlotte Bradley, Beatrice McGee, Caroline O'Callaghan, Christian Sauer, Elizabeth Sharon and Program Assistant, Evan Forcucci will be supported by Terry Currier who is stepping in to provide leadership and support. The worship team has matters in hand, with Heather and others leading family worship and the parts of the 10:30 service that I have led or supported until now. The Our Whole Lives program is underway, with Heather and Marianne both training as OWL leaders (along with Ryan Levering) in January 2019. Between these three, and those who have led the program in years past, there are many who are equipped to problem solve with the current facilitation team. The Growth and Learning Committee will have access to our ministerial staff, should they need (although they will be meeting without a staff Liaison in my absence) and the Religious Education Committee will have Heather and/or Marianne at their meetings. Although one thinks of the sabbatical as time away for the professional, it is also a growth season for the congregation. You may use skills and capacities that would never have been called forth if not for my absence. I am going to miss you all, and I hope these five months are rich and fulfilling for all of us.

Upcoming Justice Programs

Social Action and Outreach is now taking orders for Fair Trade organic COFFEE and CHOCOLATE. We buy at wholesale prices and support small farmers coops in Latin America. Order forms are available at the Social Action table, or by email from Claire McNeill. The deadline is NOVEMBER 18.

Buy UU Service Committee Christmas and Holiday cards at WUS. Social Action and Outreach will sell cards on Sundays: \$10 for 10 cards. See the 5 styles at our table. You may pay cash (or *write a check to the UUSC*) and give to a SAOC member.

A display of 287 transgender pride flags was placed on the front lawn of First Parish Church of Stow & Acton (FPC) in support of the transgender community at a time when transgender rights are coming up for referendum in Massachusetts. The blue, pink and white striped flags represent the people worldwide who were victims of antitransgender murder in 2017. On November 20 the church will host a Transgender Day of Remembrance service at 7 pm.

Take action in November to protect immigrants. MIRA is coordinating public comments opposing the Trump administration proposal to deny a green card or visa to anyone who could be deemed to be a **"public charge."** They would exclude anyone below 125% of FPL (\$31,375 for a family of 4). Immigrants deemed a "public charge" could be turned away from public programs for working families, including free school lunch. MIRA has created tools to help individuals create a public comment. **CLICK HERE**.

Hawaii: The Stolen Paradise

Hawaii was a recognized independent nation prior to January 17,1893. On that day, the nation and government were illegally overthrown by the United States.
