

A letter to Beyond Bond from WUS

Dear Beyond Bond,

Our church, the Winchester Unitarian Society, is one of nine Level 2 houses of worship, supporting the First Parish of Bedford.

Last October, Beyond Bond & Legal Defense representatives met with the First Parish of Bedford in the hopes of securing a donation of \$25,000 toward an overall goal of \$500,000. The First Parish couldn't commit to \$25,000 but offered to reach out to its Level 2 supporting congregations.

At that time, members of our Sanctuary Task Force met with members of our Social Action and Outreach Committee to discuss a goal of \$5,000. Our Social Action and Outreach Committee agreed to match up to \$2,000 of congregant donations. We are pleased to report that we have in fact exceeded our goal. Enclosed please find checks totaling \$5336.50.

We were told at the end of November that donations to Beyond Bond had already helped free 45 people from ICE detention. Thank you for all the mission work that you have done and continue to do in the Boston area.
