Participants are asked to observe the community dress code:

- 1. Girls and women shall modestly be dressed e.g. loose dress covering the arms and legs and a scarf covering the head and neck.
- 2. Boys and men shall modestly be dressed with pants covering past the knees.
- 3. Footwear shall be removed upon entering the Masjid.

We held a fine Service Day at the UU Urban Ministry in Roxbury last Saturday.

After a tour of the property and programs, our 10 members joined other volunteers in unloading, in distributing into bags many huge boxes of *fresh* vegetables. The truck was reloaded with the bags to be taken to other centers where residents would pay \$2 a bag - a fine value. Later we heard a Boston archaeologist explain the

survey being done to look for clues of native and colonial settlements there. It was eye-opening to think of the other people who called this hill "home."

U.S. Slavery in a Global Context: From the Bible to Today A talk by Lori Kenschaft Thursday, May 9, 7-9 p.m.

First Parish Unitarian Universalist of Arlington (Bailey Room) Slavery is a continuing wound in the soul of our country. But we were not alone. Before 1800, most societies included slaves. And only about 1 in 25 captured Africans ended up in the U.S. Lori Kenschaft (Ph.D. in American Studies) is the author of Lydia Maria Child: The Quest for Racial Justice and co-author of Gender Inequality in Our Changing World.
