Ram Mohan Roy and Debendranath Tagore founded the Brahmo Samaj, a philosophical movement grounded in belief in the unity of the divine and absolute equality between all people. As the "Fathers of the Indian Renaissance," their ideas led to radical reforms, challenging the caste system, child marriage and violence against women. This service reflects on the impact of this movement, including reflections from WUS member, Swati Mukherjee, who grew up in an India shaped by its affirmation of human dignity, the right of conscience and freedom of religion.

Founded in 1996 by the parents still grieving a recent loss of their son to violence, the Institute has been "a healing center, a training resource, and an education program for the city of Boston and surrounding communities."
