

RUMMAGE SALE REPORT

A pretty amazing thing happened here recently.

Beginning several months ago, a few Rummage enthusiasts began to rally around the vision of exceeding the \$14,000 fundraising amount in our budget and having a truly "not your average rummage sale."



We recalled the camaraderie we shared, the fun we had, the recycling we did and the good will we spread in 2015.

Our group grew as we chose our categories, began to pick-up and repair items and solicit donations from our members, people in Winchester and beyond.

Seventeen curators and chairpersons stepped up to oversee our 17 categories and committees. Others began to fill in our schedule of volunteers needed. Soon it became apparent we would need not only Metcalf Hall but ALL of our first floor, with the exception of the kitchen, to accommodate our growing inventory. Our advertising campaign was well designed, well executed and very successful. For 6 days we "green stickered" thousands of items: no kidding.

Finally, June 1 arrived! Curators and their assistants put on their new red aprons and set out to "be their best selves" as we acted on behalf of this congregation.

We estimate over 800 customers came to our sale. Over 60 "Early Birds" paid \$5 to enter prior to the general public. Over 675 "checkout slips" were exchanged for money by our excellent group of cashiers.

Several times we were told that we were offering the BEST RUMMAGE SALE our customers had ever attended! We felt good as we stated "This is for our church". We will happily submit over \$22,000 to our church's general fund. \$8,000 over the projected amount.

We planned well, we really worked hard, we recycled globally, and above all, we exhibited our UU values. And in the end, hopefully we left our beloved building better than we found it.

To each and everyone that touched this effort, I say WELL DONE.
