

Next ICE Detention Vigil in Boston, September 29th, 2:00 PM

The Parish of the Epiphany is organizing the monthly Interfaith Prayer Vigil at the ICE Detention Center in Boston, sponsored by MCAN (Mass Communities Action Network). Their hope is that many other Winchester organizations, faith and civic, be involved as possible. If they have the numbers to fill

it, they will have a bus to transport everyone as they did last year.

Per Phil Coonley, "of all the ICE related vigils, I've found these at the detention Center in Boston the most moving and reinforcing. About half way on the 1/4 mile walk around the facility one mounts an elevated pedestrian walk which is visible to the prisoners in the facility. and since the second floor windows are not opaque like the first floor's, many inmates are against the windows expressing their thanks for our presence. Apparently it means a lot for them to know they are not forgotten, and that many folks are sympathetic to their plight."




The WUS Racial Justice Book group will meet **Sunday, Sept 22 at 12:00** to decide books for the fall. All are welcome.

Steps Toward Decentering Whiteness

October 5, 2019 - 9:00 AM to 12:30 PM

Co-led by Meck Groot, New England Region UUA; **Patty Shepard**, Winchester Unitarian Society; and **Susan Shepherd**, First Parish Cambridge

Hosted by the Winchester Unitarian Society, 478 Main Street, Winchester, MA

Through brief presentation and lots of small group conversation, we will:

- explore the systemic issues that were at play in the search for a Lead for the Southern Region as outlined in the UUA Commission on Institutional Change's "Findings Related to the Southern Regional Lead Hiring Decision, Spring 2017,"
- \cdot apply the Commission's findings and recommendations to realities at the congregational level, and
- · identify possible steps congregations can take to decenter whiteness and to center individuals and communities with marginalized identities and experience.

Lexington Refugee Assistance **Program(LexRAP)**, is a non-profit that helps refugees, has a family that needs a 4 bedroom or very large 3 bedroom apartment or house.

The story is heart warming and compelling: The Syrian mom and sons came on a medical visa six

years ago when the older son was seriously injured in the war and they were flown to Children's for medical care. The mom was 8 months pregnant at the time and had the baby here. They applied for asylum, which was granted, and they got refugee status. The older son is now fine after several surgeries. The rest of the family escaped to Jordan.

The mom and boys have been living in a 2 bedroom apartment in Arlington for the last two years. We have known this family for many years and have great respect for how the mother has managed a very difficult situation - she has become a leader among the women LexRAP supports. Recently, 4 daughters were able to get permission to come join their mother and they just arrived in early August - after being separated for 6 years. Now their apartment is too small so they need a bigger place in Arlington, preferably, or in the general area.
