### **Adopt New Recycling Habits at WUS**

There have been a lot of changes in the recycling industry. Recycling facilities can't take the volume of material they used to process and now some items even hamper that processing. These changes affect what can be put in the recycling bin.

The Green Sanctuary Committee is updating the church's recycle lists with information from Recycle Smart, the MA Department of Environmental Protection's statewide program (<a href="www.recyclesmartma.org">www.recyclesmartma.org</a>) which promotes recycling that meets the new standards. The Town of Winchester, like many other cities and towns, has adopted this program.

New blue containers with the approved list of recyclable items will be in place around our church building beginning December 1. Companion containers will have list of items that are trash. We hope you'll look for them - and use them.
