On this Music Sunday we will hear *The Ballad of the Brown King*, a cantata written by Margaret Bonds with a libretto by Langston Hughes. This piece looks at the Christian nativity story from the perspective of Balthazar, the "brown king", who came from Arabia or



Ethiopia. It is a really rich piece musically, rewarding both in the performance and the listening. Bonds blends the European classical tradition with jazz, calypso, and other musical traditions, there is even a hint of early Motown in the work. The piece is in nine movements and scored for choir, soloists, and arranged for piano, flute, oboe, clarinet, and bass.

This Sunday, we share our gifts with **Black Lives of Unitarian Universalism (BLUU)**. BLUU provides information, resources and support for Black Unitarian




#### **Potluck Theology**

### **Sanctuary News About Maria**

January 5, 2020 will mark the second anniversary of when Maria choose to enter sanctuary in the hope of remaining legally in this country with her children. We have talked with her about how she would like to acknowledge this date. As you might imagine, at times she is disheartened that she is still here after 2 years. So this year, she has chosen to have a small dinner with her family and the sanctuary committee.

We also know that many of the volunteers were at the recommitment service last January and will be wondering how to be supportive this year. So we have a couple of suggestions of things that folks can do in her name:

**Do a Jericho Walk** – Tuesday, December 17 @ 1PM – carry a sign that says "I Walk for Maria" or something like that! (no last name please)

**Donate to a college fund** for Maria's son, Isidro, who was deported two years ago. He is currently enrolled in college and studying to become an English teacher.

 Send checks made out to Manuel A. Rodriguez with "Isidro's Fund" on the memo line and send to First Parish in Bedford, c/o Diana Finer, 75 The Great Rd, Bedford, MA 01730

**Donate to BIJAN**, a Boston immigrant rights organization that arranges bond for detained, undocumented individuals so that they can return to their families and actively pursue their cases. (Note that BIJAN will be the Share the Plate recipient for 12/15.)

### Adopt New Recycling Habits at WUS

There have been a lot of changes in the recycling industry. Recycling facilities can't take the volume of material they used to process and now some items even hamper that processing. These changes affect what can be put in the recycling bin.

The Green Sanctuary Committee is updating

the church's recycle lists with information from Recycle Smart, the MA Department of Environmental Protection's statewide program (<u>www.recyclesmartma.org</u>) which promotes recycling that meets the new standards. The Town of Winchester, like many other cities and towns, has adopted this program.

New blue containers with the approved list of recyclable items will be in place around our church building beginning December 1. Companion containers will have list of items that are trash. We hope you'll look for them - and use them.
