We organize the inauguration of the relief of Dávid Ferenc the founder of Unitarian religion in Transylvania. It will be installed on the wall at the entrance to the offices. It is a copper relief. I attach a picture of it and next week I send pictures of the inauguration. We could realize our project only with your help. We used \$1500 dollars from your last year donation. Thank you very much.

Those of us who have visited our partners in Marosvásárhely know how much they value their Unitarian heritage. We know how much this plaque will mean to them.
