
This Sunday, we share our gifts with **El Hogar**, the organization Mr. Monroe serves. Started in 1979, El Hogar provides an education and a home, if needed, for about 250 of Honduras' poorest children on four properties- an elementary school, a technical school, a residence for high school girls and a farm. El Hogar's goal is to break the cycle of poverty so that our students can fulfill their potential as productive and independent Honduran citizens.

There will be a meeting from 12 noon to 1pm after the worship service with Tim Monroe, Betsy Walsh, Cynthia Randall and Carol DeLaney to learn more about El Hogar and how to participate in an **Immersion Trip** to Honduras August 1-8 2020.

Scams By Text

Some have heard that thieves are impersonating ministers by email, asking members to purchase gift cards to benefit people in need. (Like many congregations, the WUS community was subject to this



scam in the past.) In some variations of the scam, the request comes from a board president or treasurer.

A new scam has developed, whereby thieves contact members by text, pretending to be the minister and asking them to purchase gift cards. It is unclear how they obtain the cell phone numbers. But, if you receive such an email or text, know that **no minister, staff member or leader of the congregation would solicit donations in this method.**

It is unfortunate that unscrupulous people seek to exploit the trust members place in religious leaders. If you receive such an appeal, delete and ignore!


