# Whose Laws and What Order? Police, BLM and Us

The Rev. Heather Janules

The use of police force against African Americans and other marginalized communities is one of the many catalysts to rising civil unrest, seemingly a conflict between efforts to "defund the police" and "back the blue." Yet, like many social struggles, things are not quite this simple. This service will explore how we, a diverse nation, might seek to move beyond binary, hostile positions towards a society with authentic service and protection for all.. Note that this service will reference state violence but will not include any graphic images or descriptions.

This Sunday, we share our gifts with the **Equal Justice Initiative**, providing "legal representation to indigent defendants and prisoners who have been denied fair and just treatment in the legal system."

#### **Questions for Reflection**

What have been your experiences with law enforcement officers? If you were of a different identity - gender, race, sexual orientation, ability - how might your experiences be different?

How do you respond to the idea of trauma internalized in the body?

What needs to happen for us to both support law enforcement officers while holding them accountable?

What would it look like if America abandoned "white body supremacy" as a cultural norm?

#### **Partner Church News**

We hear from minister's wife, Gizi, that, in Marosvasarhely as in Winchester, covid19 has seriously curtailed church activities. They feel safe gathering on Sunday to hear Laci's sermons but allow no more than fifty people in the sanctuary and require proper distancing. This summer, they took a group of fifty congregants to a country resort location, where each family could have its own cabin. As Gizi commented, they were together but apart. They found it a refreshing relief from virus restrictions.



Our two university scholarship students, Anna Kiss and Anna Kamenitczky, are continuing their studies, albeit remotely. Neither one is happy about that. The latter's program is in geography and tourism; the former's in artisanry. We're hoping to learn how she is able to pursue her efforts in three-dimensional art of various kinds.

The Winchester School of Chinese Culture will not be running their after-school program at WUS this year. 
