# BUDGET UPDATE from the CO-TREASURERS

We are happy to report that late last week the \$89,500 Payroll Protection Program loan was formally 100% forgiven and is officially a grant! As a result, we were able to rework the budget prior to the congregational meeting held on Sunday, October 18<sup>th</sup>. The 2020/2021 budget that was recommended by the SC was

#### The Executive Summary:

We will restore the 2.2% Cost-of-living adjustment for all of our staff
We will restore the contribution to Social Action to 5% from 4%
We will restore the 10% requested increase in dues to the UUA

Other changes are detailed in the linked document We anticipate that we will have a budget surplus of \$4,955.87
