The parents have work permits, but the father's research job has been eliminated because of COVID. He is job searching again. The mom is looking for a part time job which will enable her to be home with their child when he is not in school.

Fortunately, they are still able to house sit for a couple who are staying in Florida for the winter, but they are now facing the expense of replacing tires on the car they were given. Can you help, once again or perhaps for the first time?

## Middlesex Constituents for No Cost Calls

A bill pending in the Massachusetts legislature, Bill S. 1372, would require that prisons and jails provide telephone services to prisoners at no cost to them or to those who receive their calls. Currently, prisons and jails charge highly inflated rates, causing many low-income families to have to choose between meeting basic needs and staying in touch with their incarcerated loved ones. The pandemic exacerbates the hardship because visits to prisons and jails are shut down, scaled back or unsafe for loved ones. This is a racial justice issue, given that Black and Brown families are disproportionately impacted by the criminal legal system.

If you live in Middlesex County, please sign this letter <https://forms.gle/QPifRA7MpB9FAPEK6> to Middlesex Sheriff Peter Koutoujian, President of the Massachusetts Sheriffs' Association and a vocal opponent of this bill. Let him know that we want our taxes, not the affected families, to pay for phone calls from prisons and jails.
