Our supply is currently low. Considering how many have been challenged by the pandemic, we seek to "hire" knitters who are financially struggling and may be feeling isolated.

If you are facing financial struggle due to the pandemic, can knit somewhere between "beginner" and "professional," have access to the internet and can attend at least 2 one-hour virtual sessions via Zoom, we will purchase a shawl you create for \$100. It is not much in terms of money but we hope that the on-line "crafting in community" gatherings will add to the value of the experience. Other crafters will also be invited to join, making for a broad and rich time of reflection and conversation.

Once we have 10 participants we will schedule our first gathering. Supplies provided.

#### It's a New Year, It's a New Era: 2021 Engraved Brick Campaign

It's that time again....

Every 5 to 10 years, WUS engages in a Brick Campaign in which engraved bricks, purchased by members of the congregation, are added to church walkways. This year, the retired Pastoral Care Associates are spearheading the initiative to add engraved bricks to the planned Celebration Walkways designed by WUS landscape designer

Julie Khuen and made possible by the landscaping gift given so lovingly and generously by the Virnelli family in honor of Judy Virnelli. The new Bell Tower Terrace and Walkways to Mystic Valley Parkway and Main Street will be completed by Fall of 2021 when we will gather together once again to celebrate WUS and the community we share.

Through the engraved bricks, each of us may honor, celebrate and/or remember loved ones or special milestones in our personal or collective history. One 4" x 8" engraved brick can be purchased for \$100. Part of the cost of each brick will go towards laying the Walkways. **Deadline for submitting a brick order is March 1st.**
