FREEDOM!

It is with great joy that we share the news that, after living in sanctuary for more than three years at First Parish Bedford, Maria has received a oneyear stay of deportation! While she is now free to enjoy daily life without fear, Maria will not leave the church immediately as she and her support team secure the resources she needs to resettle in the community.



As a Level 2 Sanctuary congregation, WUS has been an active member of a coalition of faith communities supporting Maria and FPB through volunteering, advocacy and financial support.

On-Going Scam Attempts: What You Should Do

On February 27th and the following Sunday, we brought to the congregation's attention that WUS has been targeted in a new scam.



The thief impersonated a staff person by

email and requested the password to access the member directory. Having received the password, they have since downloaded the directory and have been impersonating Rev. Heather by email with two different messages, asking for gift cards for worthy causes. You can tell the request is fraudulent as there are slight differences between the email they use and Heather's WUS email address. Also, Rev. Heather does not solicit gift cards this way. Adding some humor to the situation, they have also confused ministers and congregations and have impersonated another local UU minister and requested gift cards from WUS members in *their* name.

We have changed the password to the member side of the website, removed the directory from this page and have reported the fraudulent email addresses to Google. **Contact the office if you need access to the member side of the website.**

We are asking all of you to respond in these ways:


- **Do not** buy gift cards and provide their codes to anyone on behalf of WUS, especially via email.
- While we appreciate being notified that this is happening, do not forward these emails to Rev. Heather and/or the office. The email traffic has been overwhelming. We are aware of the situation. Just delete the email and hope that the scammers make a positive change and use their obvious intelligence and talents for honest work.
- **Do not** forward an electronic copy of the directory to anyone; prompt someone needing the information to contact the office.
- **Do** spread the word about this situation among other members of the WUS community. The best way to counter these cynical attempts is to ensure that everyone is educated about what is occurring and prepared to recognize electronic impersonation when it happens.

These scams would not work if members of faith communities did not want to partner with their clergy to make the world a better place. In the end, while these scams are disheartening, let us focus our attention on the legitimate positive change we all create together through our service and generosity. **Thank you!**


SABBATH SIT

- An accessible restroom on the ground floor is to begin construction in March.
