SABBATH SIT



- We are pleased to announce that the Judy Virnelli Memorial re-landscaping of our Mystic Valley Parkway entrance with the Memorial Brick Walkway is scheduled to begin this spring.
- An **HVAC update** that will improve fresh air circulation throughout the church and improved heating in the chapel to be completed this spring.
- An accessible restroom on the ground floor is to begin construction in March. Thank you to the Building Committee and several architects in the WUS community who managed the constraints of plumbing and building structure to find a suitable location in the vestibule near the back entrance. Although the vestibule will be a bit smaller, many unsightly plumbing and heating pipes will become less visible and our "Team Re-Do" will bring aesthetic touches to

integrate the new bathroom with the space. We are grateful to be able to provide accessible facilities for our community!


