We've partnered with <u>Maxsold</u>, an online auction company specializing in downsizing and estate sales, which is offering fee-free auctions to nonprofits during Covid. That means all the money we raise through the auction will be used to support WUS.

We'll be asking WUS members to donate gently-used, vintage, new, and interesting items for the auction. With everyone spending more time at home, this is the ideal time to dig out those "treasures" and give them new life. Donations can be dropped off at WUS in early November, and will be auctioned off to support WUS, so please start setting them aside.

What can you donate? It's really anything that has value: Smaller furniture like side tables and benches, new and used tools, classic cameras, costume jewelry, watches,

book collections, vintage and collectables, Mid-Century Modern, and home décor like framed prints, matching lamps, mirrors and rugs, as well as sports memorabilia, newer exercise and sports equipment, new electronics like Rhomba or classic electronics like speakers and turntables, and even Pokeman classic cards are just a few examples. 

UUSJ (Unitarian Universalists for Social Justice) September 2021 - Write Here! Write Now! Tell Your U.S. Senators to Support Voting Rights

We have a rare moment to pass legislation protecting voting rights. This year <u>18 states</u> have already enacted <u>30 laws making it more difficult to vote</u>. These especially impact voters of color, indigenous voters and young people – folks who voting laws are supposed to protect.

We are therefore urging senators to support the For the People Act and the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act. Together these establish clear voting rights for all and prevent partisan gerrymandering. Senators must not allow the filibuster to kill these popular bills.

Please use this <u>convenient online letter writing platform</u> to edit and send letters to your senators. They need to hear from as many of us as possible to re-enforce the importance of this legislation, and thank them for their efforts.

UU Grounding: As UUs, we affirm the sacredness and power of each voice and vote. Our 5th UU Principle compels us "to advocate for a healthy, inclusive democratic process." On June 26 the UUA General Assembly approved an Action of Immediate Witness (AIW), a resolution to Stop Voter Suppression and Partner for Voting Rights and a Multiracial Democracy. **See full text here.**

Each year our Unitarian Universalist Association calls our congregations to focus on crucial issues of justice and equity. In 2021 the Actions of Immediate Witness have been The Covid-19 Pandemic; Stop Voter Suppression; Defend and Advocate with Transgender, Non-Binary, and Intersex Communities.

There is also an important <u>2021 Statement of</u> <u>Conscience: Undoing Systemic White Supremacy.</u> Its opening reads:

"Seeking universal justice and equity, we call upon the Unitarian Universalist Association and Unitarian Universalist individuals and congregations/groups to actively engage in undoing systemic white supremacy in all of its manifestations..."
