
Dance For All Ages Sunday, October 3rd from 4-6pm

Join the Racial Justice Planning Group to take a look at our congregational structures.

Are they working for us? How do we encourage practices towards diversity, equity, and inclusion in the work of our decision-making and leadership?

"Widening the Circle of Concern," (the report of the UUA Commission on Institutional Change) urges us all to be proactive and intentional as we consider how to make our religion a welcoming home for ALL. We are joining the many congregations in the UUA community at large to look at ourselves, using the UUA Study/Action Guide for the commission's report.

You have probably heard that Rev Heather led our first workshop on "Theology," based on the Study/Action Guide in late March and that Rebecca helped us to conduct the "Hospitality and Inclusion" workshop in June, 2021. We hope you can make time to attend all of these crucial workshops, and the next one is on Governance. You can find the outline for this particular workshop on page 8 of the Study/Action Guide pdf. BUILDING BELOVED COMMUNITY, ACTION BY ACTION

Your Racial Justice Team continues this week with the second of four action ideas supporting the UUA "Call to Prophetic Action: 2021 Statement of Conscience, Undoing Systemic White Supremacy."

(See https://www.uua.org/action/statements/u ndoing-systemic-white-supremacy.) Last week we posted Action 1: Engage with the movement.

Action 2: Carry forward the recommended healing actions conveyed in "Widening the Circle of Concern." As with other complex, embedded social problems, undoing systemic white supremacy requires not only engaging in action beyond our denomination, but also internal work to overcome the ways in which it weaves itself into our group cultures, interpersonal relationships, and individual ingrained biases. Affirming the knowledge and vital guidance detailed in the UUA Commission on Institutional Change report, Widening the Circle of Concern, we are called to implement recommendations releasing ourselves from the limits of systemic white supremacy embedded in our structures and habits so we can live our shared values more fully and freely.

Action 2 is eminently timely and accessible! Bring your voice to Widening the Circle of Concern: Workshop on Governance, Tuesday, October 19, from 7 to 8:30 p.m. (virtual). We will be looking at our congregational structures of decision-making and leadership practices, how they function, and how they support the practices of diversity, equity, and inclusion. 
