Cold Weather Update: 'tis the season! Especially now that the colder weather is upon is, please remember that in the event of rainy/cold weather, our plan is to go into Metcalf Hall. Besides being a big room, what you may not know is that Metcalf Hall has been updated with a state of the art air exchange system that filters all incoming air and exchanges the air in the room 4-5x an hour. We made this upgrade during the pandemic to keep our community safe, and hope that this will help you make a more informed decision about your child's participation during colder weather. Parents are also given the option at sign-in to come get their kids instead if we feel like we need to move indoors.

### Freedom to Vote Rally in Washington, DC

Saturday, October 23, 11:30 - 1pm corner of Constitution Ave. NW & NJ Ave. NW

We're into October, and the U.S. Senate has not been able to protect the freedom to vote due to partisan Senate obstructionism.

We are going to need to pull out all the stops to get the Freedom to Vote Act to the finish line. A broad coalition of organizations both local (Indivisible Massachusetts Coalition, MA Standing Up for Racial Justice, Indivisible Northampton, Swing Blue Alliance) and national (Common Cause, SEIU, NOW, Sierra Club, Brennan Center for Justice, Public Citizen and many others) have joined together to plan a Freedom to Vote rally in Washington, D.C.

Passing this bill is especially critical, since some swing-state legislatures have recently passed (or are proposing) laws giving themselves the ability to nullify the will of the voters and *declare* election winners.

Nowhere is it "chiseled in stone" that democracies cannot wither and perish. It has happened before; it is happening in Hungary, and in Poland, and it's threatening our own democracy with the "Flat Earth", science-denying, Jonestown-like cult of personality that we see trumping reason here in broad daylight.

It's as insidious, frightening and despair-inducing as it is puzzling, but as Mother Jones advised: Don't mourn; organize.

Since this Rally is happening while the Covid-pandemic is still with us, it complicates the logistics of getting safely to-and-from D.C. People are arranging to go by train, or bus, car, passenger van, etc.
