It has been wonderful to be able to return to inperson gathering, and it has taken the work of many hands! Thank you to all who have volunteered in some way to help bring us back together.

In particular, the Building Committee, led by Chuck Khuen, helped to make our building a safer place to gather with many ventilation and air quality measures. This document (also on our website) will remain a helpful reference for all who are planning meetings and gatherings in our building.

As part of the Standing Committee's retreat on Saturday, October 16th, we explored the impact of

the pandemic separation on our WUS experience.

- What we missed during the time we did not meet together. sacred space, casual conversation, community, connections, being together, being involved, service work and a safe place to gather
- What we gained rituals at home, new ways to connect, an understanding of our struggles with change, closer to family and nature, intimacy with smaller group
- What we crave now re-identify the relevance of church to our life, support, friendship, more people engaged with church, service work, intergenerational activities, intentionally accepting all people
- What does WUS community crave? feeling safe, feeling empowered, freedom, control, fun together, expanded community, after church conversations

We used this exploration to help shape our goals for the coming year. We will share these goals with all of the committees at the November 11th Committee Chairs Meeting led by our Nominating and Leadership Development committee. All committees will be invited to identify actions they can take in support of these goals. We hope that our goals reflect the needs and wishes of our congregation as a whole. We invite all in the community to share in our work together to re-build and strengthen our community connections, to envision our future in new ways and to create both sacred and fun space together.


Together, we can make Thanksgiving a happy holiday for many families in the Woburn/Winchester area who are facing difficult times.

10:30 am - Outdoor RE for K-6: Per usual, we will be meeting in the playground for outdoor RE this week. Kids are strongly encouraged to come in costume! We will be starting RE with some of our weekly traditions, then moving into some Halloween-themed games together. A bit after 11:30 we will migrate across the parking lot to the Halloween SpUUktacular, where we will do some more games as a group and then decorate pumpkins together. SpUUky snacks will be served at the event, but please bring additional food if you think your young one will need it before 12:30.

Cold Weather Update: 'tis the season! Especially now that the colder weather is upon is, please remember that in the event of rainy/cold weather, our plan is to go into Metcalf Hall. Besides being a big room, what you may not know is that Metcalf Hall has been updated with a state of the art air exchange system that filters all incoming air and exchanges the air in the room 6-8x an hour. We made this upgrade during the pandemic to keep our community safe, and hope that this will help you make a more informed decision about your child's participation during colder weather. Parents are also given the option at sign-in to come get their kids instead if we feel like we need to move indoors.
