New Children's Religious Education Coordinator Position – Spread the Word!

After much discernment with many voices heard, we have developed the position of Children's Religious Education Coordinator to move us into the next era of our Religious Education program.

Sam Wilson has been doing a fantastic job as interim coordinator in addition to his role as Director of Youth Ministries. In this new configuration, Sam will be the Director of Youth and Children's Ministry and will supervise this new position whose role will primarily be to run the



Pre-K through 6th grade programming. The Coordinator will also administratively support the 7th and 8th grade programming consisting of the Our Whole Lives program and a new middle school youth group run by Sam. This will be a part-time position for 11 months of the year.

Our bylaws preclude members from being employed at WUS, but perhaps you could spread the word about the job opening beyond the congregation? Here's the announcement for you to circulate:

and see many of you again in-person this Sunday (hopefully including the 3 kids we haven't seen since the Pageant! We've missed you!)

This Sunday, we will be celebrating our return to in-person and our final Sunday of Feb Fest with a Feb Fest Fiesta (and Stuffie Reunion!) We will be doing lots of fun things together for this festive occasion, including fiesta-themed food and activities. We recently met with a parent who is an Infectious Diseases physician/Public Health consultant who helped us talk this through. We have come up with several ways to help us reduce our risks throughout the trip as well as contingency plans in case something does happen.

We will be sharing more details with the trip attendees in the coming months (and of course, we will be continuing to track numbers, etc.) Based on current estimates though, we remain very hopeful that we will still be able to go to War (West Virginia, that is!) We look forward to our upcoming in-person meetings so that we can have everyone around as we begin shifting our focus toward preparing (mentally and emotionally) for the trip ahead of us.

- 2. Early in March, SAOC members contact the sponsors of the organizations applying for grants, for which they will be the reviewer, and clarify the process, as needed.
- 3. Sponsors notify the organization about the grant opportunity, obtain contact information, and learn about any possible special project to which the grant might contribute.
- 4. Sponsors find the <u>Grant Application Form</u> and complete Section I and II, before sending it to the organization. Please request the application be returned to the sponsor well before the March 31st deadline and convey our preference for electronic applications and simple financial statements. https://www.winchesteruu.org/wp-content/uploads/2021/01/Grant-Application-2021.pdf
- 5. On receipt of the application, sponsors make sure it is complete, and then send it to the designated reviewer on the SAOC via email.
- 6. Complete applications must be submitted by the sponsor to the reviewing SAOC member by March 31.


