This morning, we share our gifts with International Women's Convocation and the Partner Church Program - Romania is opening its doors and hearts for those fleeing from Ukraine. As of February 28, 2022, more than 67,000 Ukrainians have found refuge in Romania. In Transylvania, refugees enter through two border points about 110 miles from the headquarters of the Hungarian Unitarian Church. We are joining the appeal for humanitarian aid issued by the Providence Charity Organization of the Hungarian Unitarian Church. Your donation will help provide women and families immediate aid, such as transportation from the border, emergency shelter, food, water, hygiene kits, infant supplies, clothing, pet care, and psychological support.

#### **Music Notes:**

The music this morning is offered as a prayer for the people in Ukraine and all those affected by war. The very elegant and moving *Peace Piece* perhaps needs no explanation. I offer the Chopin *Mazurka* in honor of all the refugees moving out of Ukraine, many into Poland, where Chopin was born. We should also remember that Chopin was a refugee himself, unable to return to his home country after the failed Polish uprising of 1830-31 because he refused to take a Russian passport. The Tsar would later ban Chopin's music in Poland. As the Russian forces advanced on Kharkiv, a reporter captured a young pianist playing the hauntingly beautiful *Walk to School* in a hotel lobby there. In solidarity, I present this piece as the postlude.

The Anthem is a delightful piece describing the many ways church "builds the path of love", "picks up the fallen," and "holds the lost and found." For that, we have *Amazing Gratitude*. Hal Walker is the Music Director of the UU church in Kent, Ohio.
