As part of our commitment to racial justice, each worship service includes wisdom or an artistic gift from people or communities-of-color.

Notes on Seed Paper Hearts: These handmade items are from paper formed one sheet at a time in Seattle. They are made with 100% post industrial waste and 100% tree-free, acid-free fiber. Embedded in this stick is a unique North American Wildflower seed blend. The seeds include Snapdragon, Petunia, Beardtongue, Daisy, Thyme, Poppy, Foxglove, Catchfly, Maiden Pinks, & Chamomile. Plant directly into the soil in a pot or in your garden. The dirt should be firmed down after sowing and the seeds should not be more than ½ inch deep. Keep moist for 4-6 weeks and ensure 4 hours of sunlight each day in order to germinate properly. The plants can grow as tall as 3 feet.
