

And May 10, 1869, or Golden Spike Day, recognizes the completion of the first transcontinental railroad in the U.S., which had significant contributions from Chinese workers. Dear NST Friends, April has been full, and May promises more.

Books, bikes, and toys are gradually becoming part of our young family's vocabulary. The preschool team is carefully introducing books, songs, and educational toys (Duplos! and rolling vehicles) which our little friends are experiencing for the first time. The Ongoing Needs team not only collected bikes and helmets (compliments of APD) for all, but also found Lowry Keys, the bike whisperer, through his wife Colleen and FB posts. Lowry checked out each bike and adjusted whatever needed adjusting to make them all driveway, sidewalk, and road ready. Thank you and welcome to Team WIRP!

The family visited The Arlington Boys and Girls Club where Sapna and Toheed will attend summer camp and Fidelity House where they will spend two days/week starting in the fall. Mansor is wild about his Sunday soccer clinics at Thompson School field Sundays, 1-2:15 pm. Look for the MINT (green) team. Watch Mansor play and

practice English with Ihsanullah on the sidelines. Just show up and introduce yourself.

Adil and Mansor will attend Summer ELL at the Bishop School and will need transportation help. Please look at your schedule on T/W/TH, 8:30-12 noon, July 5 - 28. **NST volunteers are invited to sign up to help with rides here <u>Summer ELL ride</u> <u>sign up</u>.** 

Ihsanullah and Zahida had their first parent-teacher conference on April 7<sup>th</sup>, with the assistance of a Pashto interpreter. Everyone's English is improving! Watch for opportunities to practice one-on-one with them soon!

Ihsanullah is working with Bob on exploring work options. He has a basic resume now and is eager to work.

The entire family visited Smile Boutique in Winchester for a successful marathon dental checkup; follow up appointments have begun. Many thanks to the Smile dentists who are offering all care to the family gratis and to Ron and Joan for organizing.

Ramadan is almost over, and Eid celebrations are approaching. The family received a generous food gift from the Muslim American Community Center in Lexington this week to prepare for Eid. Thanks to Carol Kelso for picking up the gift bag and delivering it to the family on very short notice! The Rawans have two big EID celebrations coming up.

On April 30 the Islamic Society of Boston in Wayland is the host and on May 7 Seeme Moreira and Bob are coordinating an Eid al-Fitr celebration at The Parish of the Epiphany for Afghan families in our geographic area. There will be new clothes, laughter, and delicious food, with lots of time to solidify community and celebrate with fellow Afghans.

More surprises for our family: a special Eid Mubarak gift bag (treats for the kids, dates, decorations) and gift certificates/cards to Trader Joe's and Magic Bites (Turkish food) are coming their way thanks to the kindness and generosity of perfect strangers in the amazing EIFA – Everything is Free/Arlington – community. Monica Abdel-Azim created the gift bag and Sarah Tuttle passed the gift card/certificates to them for their Eid celebrations. Finally, the Rawans are over the moon excited to welcome blood family who are driving up from Virginia to spend three days of Eid with them here in Arlington!
