# A Religious Response to the Overturning of Roe v. Wade 

With its decision in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, issued in June of this year, the new conservative majority on the Supreme Court deleted with one stroke--and perhaps for the first time in the Court's history--a fundamental Constitutional guarantee that had been the law of the land for 50 years. The guarantee was that, at least during the early stages of pregnancy, neither the states nor the federal government could interfere with a woman's right to make her own decision about whether to bear a child or not. In the post-Dobbs world, governments at both the state and federal level may now intrude upon that personal and private sphere and, in so doing, may now, in effect, control a woman's destiny. This Sunday we will explore how people of liberal religious faith might respond to the Dobbs decision's curtailment of women's status as free and equal members of American society. ## WUS Contributions Support Sister Church

## Relief Efforts for Ukrainian Refugees

Members of WUS have thus far donated $\$ 8000$ to our sister church in Transylvania to help fund its efforts, and the efforts of Unitarian churches throughout that region, to provide relief services to refugees from the Ukraine fleeing the war initiated in February by Russia.

Since refugees first started coming in late February, Unitarian churches have been hosting an average of 50 people in church properties and private accommodations. In addition to housing, meals, medical care, job placement, vocational counseling and administrative assistance have been provided to refugees.

A particular highlight of their aid activities has been the launch of a Ukrainian kindergarten group, which has been operating since April 5 at the Unitarian Day Care Centre in Cluj Napoca. The activities of the group of 20 children are led by two Ukrainian kindergarten teachers. A summer camp was also organized which provided services to 21 Ukrainian children, enabling them to take part in such activities as swimming, hikes, barbeques and singing at evening campfires.

## Religious Education

In our First Reflection in church on Sunday, we talked about the Jewish celebration of Rosh Hashanah. I told a story about potatoes and letting go of what keeps us from growing and learning. Everyone who wanted one received a potato to take home as a reminder - and to make latkes!

## Get Out The Vote!

## You can help to encourage "low propensity" voters to cast their votes in November!



UU the Vote has partnered with another non-partisan group called the New Georgia Project (NGP) (https://newgeorgiaproject.orgL) to make phone-calls to under-represented, lower income citizens who would otherwise be less likely to vote.
These are not persuasion calls; not recruitment-calls: they're "just" Get Out the Vote calls.

While the call lists provided by the New Georgia Project were not created in a partisan manner, nevertheless both UU the Vote and NGP are confident that these voters are likely to share our UU values of justice, equality and inclusion.

In addition, the auto-dialer that's being used can detect voicemailprompts and blocking apps, and only brings you on the line when an actual person has picked up. Please let me know if you're interested in participating in this action.

# Pandemic Protocol Update 9/27/2022 

## Dear Congregants and Friends ~

The PPTF is continuing to gather CO2 data which inform our guidelines. We wish to share that data with you and reiterate our current protocols so that all can make the choices that are best for you.

You may remember that at our first In-Gathering Service on September 11th, with doors closed and ceiling fans off, the CO2 sensor went above 800 (ppm). We immediately changed our protocols asking the sexton and ushers to have all windows open, the ceiling fans on, and the doors in the back of the sanctuary open during worship. The good news is that at the services on September 18th and 25th the CO2 sensor did not go above 480 (ppm). This is also the case at John Russell's memorial service. We are very pleased that air circulation has improved and that our numbers have remained consistently low. We plan to continue monitoring the CO2 levels and will keep you updated.

Since our protocols are working, please continue following them at Sunday Worship:

- Please enter the building and the sanctuary masked so that our youngest can join us safely and comfortably.
- When the children leave the service for religious education in Metcalf Hall, those who wish to remove their mask may do so.
- In order to maximize air circulation while our heating and venting system is not in use, we have asked that the sexton and ushers have all windows open, the ceiling fans on and the doors in the back of the sanctuary open during the service.
- The head usher will monitor the CO2 sensor. Should the monitor reach $800(\mathrm{ppm})$, the ushers will turn on the standing fans to assist in air flow out of the sanctuary. At $800(\mathrm{ppm})$, the concentration of CO2 is still safe, but the likelihood of viral transmission is growing. Should an increase of CO2 to even higher levels occur, a
determination can be made, an announcement made, and those who wish may choose to put their mask back on.
- We will continue to serve coffee outdoors. Should the weather prohibit this, we feel that Symmes does not provide adequate space for unmasked socializing and eating, so we will not serve food or beverages. Please remain sensitive to others who choose to wear a mask while socializing indoors.
- On Sundays Metcalf Hall will be used by the Religious Education program once the children leave the service. But for events not happening on Sunday mornings, masks will be optional and food may be served in Metcalf Hall.


## For Children \& Youth:

- The Nursery and both RE classes for K-6 will all happen in Metcalf Hall. Children should arrive wearing masks. Spirit Play (K-4) will require masks, though Neighboring Faiths (5-6) may be optional, depending on the comfort of the group. Nursery staff are required to wear masks but masks will be optional for babies/toddlers in childcare. Masks in OWL will be decided by OWL parents at their orientation, and will be optional for WUSYG.

We will continue monitoring both COVID data and the CO2 sensor data, as well as "taking the pulse" of our community. As always, we hope to allow the most freedom in gathering while providing safety for those who may be more at risk. We will continue to make adjustments as needed according to the information we have.

We want to see everyone in person and have a vibrant sense of connection and community while always keeping health and safety in mind. If you feel unwell, please do not come to church. Share the love, not the virus...
