Music Notes:

There is a surprising amount of music written about cats. The Kindling music is by jazz legend Carla Bley in the early 1970's. \neq The anthem is from Ivor Davies' *Prayers from the Ark*, a set of six pieces based on the poetry of Carmen Bernos De Gastzold. \neq Samuel Barber gives us a picture of a Monk and his Cat - the 8th song in his collection of *Hermit Songs*. These poems were written by an anonymous Irish monk who lived sometime between the 8th and 13th century. The poems were translated by W.H. Auden. \neq Jazz bassist and composer Charles Mingus, who created the postlude, was a great lover of cats, including his own cat Nightlife.
