

Zahida and Aisha came home late Tuesday afternoon. Mom and baby are doing well. Four out of five siblings are delighted and have told their classmates all about their new sister! The last one is working on it.

Aisha, the first US citizen in the Rawan family, arrived in time to join her family at their immigration status interview later this week.


# **Religious Education**
