The anthem this morning sets a text by Sophia Lyons Fahs: "We pause in reverence before the wonder of life, the wonder of this moment, the wonder of being together, so close yet so apart– each hidden in his own secret chamber, each listening, each trying to speak. Yet none fully understanding, none fully understood. We pause in reverence before all intangible things – that eyes see not, nor ears can detect - that hands can never touch - that space cannot hold, and time cannot measure. There is never an end to our yearning to know the unknown after all our labor at learning. There is never an end to our trying the untried after all our failures in striving. Fling wide the windows, the bright beams of morning are warm!" ♦ For the Kindling music, I chose a selection from Debussy's Images – musical depictions of things for us to observe. Here it is a temple in the moonlight. Legendary jazz composer and pianists gives us Reflections for the Offertory, and we close with a tribute to spring. Notice the bird song and burbling brook in Vivald's music.
