Music Notes:

The Austrian composer Franz Schubert is known for his exquisite melodies; he also suffered from mood swings and extreme sorrow. He is quoted as saying: "My compositions spring from my sorrows. Those that give the world the greatest delight were born of my deepest griefs." And so it feels so fitting to present his music here in this service. The Kindling Music is the third Impromptu from a set of four written in 1827. The Offertory, Frühlingsgaube (Faith in Spring) was written in 1820 and sets a poem by Johann Uhland. The text invites is to set aside our sorrows and put your faith in the renewal of springtime. ♦ I've been looking forward to presenting the postlude for sometime - Debussy's wonderful "Island of Joy". Listen for how the expansive, joyful theme emerges from mysterious clouds surrounding the island.
