

The Theme for June is **Delight**





6-13-2023 Update from the Pandemic Planning Task Force (PPTF)

The Staff and PPTF gathered this week for our final meeting of this church year. Although Covid-19 is still circulating, we are no longer in a declared pandemic. The national public health emergency has been lifted. People of all ages can be vaccinated with multiple boosters, and there are medical treatments widely available. Using the many tools available, we are learning to live with the virus, as well as the potential threat of pandemics in the future. In recognition of this new phase, the Pandemic Planning Task Force and Staff have updated our protocols and guidelines. The full text can be found on the home page of the website and HERE. At this time,

 Masks are encouraged but not required for all who enter the building and for Sunday Worship.

- In order to maximize air circulation while our heating and venting system is not in use, windows may be opened, the ceiling fans may be on, and the doors in the back of the sanctuary kept open during the service.
- When possible, we will continue to have coffee hour outdoors and offer outdoor options for dining at potlucks.

The PPTF wants to reinforce that Long Covid is an issue that many folks, including in our congregational community, are dealing with. Some information is HERE that we hope helps us all appreciate what this can involve.

The PPTF will remain an active resource to the staff and W.U.S. We will meet again in early September to assess the current situation.

We want to see everyone in person to have a vibrant sense of connection and community, BUT if you feel unwell, please do not come to church. Share the Love, not the virus...any virus!

Other RE Happenings

Preregistration is open for next year's RE classes. It helps us immensely if you can tell us in advance that you're planning to enroll your children in RE for next year. You can find the registration form here: https://forms.gle/kulnts8AFZi72jyB6. Our RE family will be expanding next year, welcoming another Spirit Play classroom. Here are the classes we're enrolling for the coming year:

 Nursery and Toddler Room: Lots of love and fun abound in our nursery and toddler room for infants through preschool age children, with each Sunday providing another craft or other activity related to the subject the other classes are working on.

• **Spirit Play 1:** Children in kindergarten through second grade are welcome to this Spirit Play class that explores our UU principles (or promises, as SP calls them) through stories and activities presented and facilitated using the Montessori Method.

- **Spirit Play 2:** Children in grades 3 and 4 are welcome to this Spirit Play class that makes good use of the curriculum's extension materials to adjust the content to an older audience.
- **Neighboring Faiths:** Children in grades 5 through 7 are welcome to Neighboring Faiths, where we spend a few months exploring Unitarian Universalism and then move on to study other world religions. This two-year curriculum will be in its second year, so we encourage the current NF kids to stay for the second year to get the full experience!

We'll be returning to the RE classrooms in the fall, so we'll be able to make all of the spaces more welcoming, comfortable, and "ours"!

This coming Monday, June 19th, honors the emancipation of enslaved African Americans in the United States. The name "Juneteenth" is a blend of two words: "June" and "nineteenth." It's believed to be the oldest African-American holiday, with annual celebrations in different parts of the country dating back to 1866. In addition to recognizing the end of slavery, many take the day to celebrate African-American culture.

The first Juneteenth flag was flown at Heritage Park in Roxbury, MA, in 2000. The flag intentionally uses the same colors as the United States flag to show that the formerly enslaved and their descendants are free Americans, too. The individual symbols depicted in the flag represent:

- The Arc: A new horizon, meaning fresh opportunities and promising futures for Black Americans.
- **The Star**: A nod to the Lone Star State where Juneteenth was first celebrated in 1865, and it also stands for the freedom of every Black American in all 50 states.

The Burst: The outline surrounding the star is meant to reflect a nova

 or new star—which represents a new beginning of striving for freedom and equality for all.

We can honor this holiday by patronizing Black-owned businesses and/or by donating to organizations that serve and/or are run by African-Americans.
