As part of our commitment to racial justice, each worship service includes wisdom or an artistic gift from people- or communities-of-color.

Music Notes:

Remembering that the Jewish calendar day begins at sunset, last night marked the start of the third day of Hanukkah. So while we may not actually have latkes to eat, it is a good time to celebrate with Hanukkah music. The service begins with a few favorites; the Flory Jagoda song *Ocho Kandelikas* written in Ladino, a hybrid of Hebrew and Spanish; and *Candlelight* by the Maccabeats, a Jewish vocal group whose take on the Taio Cruz hit song *Dynamite* is just wonderful. The centerpiece of the service is David Ludwig's Four Hanukkah Songs. This is part of a larger Hanukkah cantata first performed in 2007 by the Choral Arts Society of Philadelphia for whom it was composed.

The songs are traditional Hanukkah songs, arranged in exquisite form to be performed by the choir. They tell the story of Hanukkah, about the hero Judas Maccabee who saved the Jewish people from the oppression of the Syrian Greeks. They tell of the miracle and redemption made possible by God. And they tell of the strength that humans can find to persevere over adversity. We will light the Menorah after the third movement – *Candle Blessings*. It should be noted that the candles are ritually lit at sundown and usually at home, so we are taking some liberties in bringing this practice into our sanctuary so that we can share this together.
