Music Notes:

The Anthem comes from Canadian composer Eleanor Daley's *Requiem*. The text, which follows, is variously attributed to Mary Elizabeth Frye, Clare Harner, or Anonymous: "Do not stand at my grave and weep/I am not there. I do not sleep./I am a thousand winds that blow./I am the diamond glints on snow./I am the sunlight on ripened grain./I am the gentle autumn rain./ When you awaken in the morning's hush/I am the swift uplifting rush/Of quiet birds in circled flight./I am the soft stars that shine at night./Do not stand at my grave and cry;/I am not there. I did not die." We remember our beloved with a sung litany borrowed from the Catholic liturgical tradition. And we close with the exquisite *Goodbye Pork Pie Hat*, composed by jazz bassist Charles Mingus. The song is an elegy for the saxophonist Lester Young who was known to wear the iconic hat.
